## 2024 Plattsburgh Refuse Program

**SINGLE FAMILY WEEKLY PICK-UP**: \$31.85 per month for a weekly pick-up of bagged household garbage and recylables inside provided garbage tote and recycling bin.

**SINGLE FAMILY OPTIONAL BI-WEEKLY PICK-UP**: \$18.25 per month with a limit of 1garbage tote (65gal or 95gal) of bagged household garbage inside provided garbage tote and unlimited recyclables.

\*\*Charge of \$4.00 per bag over the 1 tote limit (regardless of bag size).

#### **MULTIPLE FAMILY DWELLINGS:**

3 to 5 Apartments - \$77.35 per month 6 to 7 Apartments - \$151.35 per month 8 to 10 Apartments - \$200.50 per month

Over 10 Apartments - \$27.00 per apartment per month

\*All apartments need to be on our service and accounts need to be in the landlords name.

## **COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES** (without dumpsters):

Bagged garbage in 95 Gallon Tote / plus recyclables \$36.15 per month for once a week pick-up

\$63.85 per month for twice a week pick-up

\*Charge of \$4.00 each bag or container over 6 Bag limit\*

# DEPOSIT OF \$50.00 WILL BE REQUIRED FOR GARBAGE TOTE PRIOR TO THE START OF SERVICE \*\*Deposit will be retained if garbage tote is not returned when service is cancelled

\*REFUSE AND RECYCLABLES ARE TO BE PLACED AT CURBSIDE BEFORE 7:00AM. REFUSE MUST BE IN CLEAR BAGS INSIDE THE GARBAGE TOTE AND RECYCLING BIN MUST BE USED FOR RECYCLABLES.

**GRASS, LEAVES & SMALL BRANCHES** (1" or less in diameter/size): Are to be placed at curbside in 30 – 50 gallon paper bags or clearly labeled biodegradable yard waste bags, at no charge to all city residents. **Clear plastic or colored bags will not be collected.** Yard waste bags will be rejected if: bags are plastic, weigh more than 40 lbs., are split/broken open or contain household garbage, construction debris, branches over 1" in diameter/size, dirt, soil, sand, animal waste or dead animals. **DO NOT** rake grass or leaves into the street.

\*\* <u>Pick-up Policy</u>: Yard waste pick up follows the same sequence of streets as refuse and recycling, however due to workload and seasonal changes the day yard waste is picked on each street will vary. Please be patient!

**SPECIAL PICK-UPS**: There is an extra charge for all refuse that is not considered normal household garbage, and/or may require special handling and separation. Examples of items that require a special pick-up are tree branches, limbs, construction or demolition debris, metal, wood, appliances (except for refrigerators, air conditioners and other appliances that contain freon which are not accepted), furniture, mattresses, carpeting, padding, hot water heater tanks, clothing, toys, pool covers, etc. Contact Public Works for pricing and to make arrangements for special pick-ups.

**SMALL LOAD**: \$30.00 for City refuse customer / \$35.00 for non-refuse customer **LARGE LOAD**: \$80.25 for City refuse customer / \$85.25 for non-refuse customer

\*Any unlisted service will be an hourly labor and equipment charge and will be determined prior to providing the service.

TIRES: Must be off the rim and will be picked up at curbside for a separate charge per tire, in addition to the special pick-up fee. A regular size car or truck tire is \$10.00 per tire.

**DISPOSAL OF USED HYPODERMIC NEEDLES**: Place used hypodermic needles in heavy plastic jug with a lid and label the plastic jug with "Medical Waste" sticker. Place the jug in a regular clear garbage bag and not in the recycling bin.

**LIGHT BULBS**: Place in a separate bag outside your garbage container. Bulbs containing mercury are not acceptable and will need to be taken to the landfill on Hazardous Waste Day (which is the first Saturday in June of every year).

**PAINT CANS**: Place empty/dry paint cans and separated lids in a separate bag outside your garbage container (discard paint and dry the can using sand or kitty litter).

BILLING PROCEDURES: All customers will be billed once a month, in arrears, for services rendered in the previous month. No credit or adjustment will be made to a monthly bill if the customer did not use the service during part of a month. Service may be suspended for one or more calendar months if the customer notifies the Department of Public Works prior to the effective date of the change.

#### **RECYCLABLES**

\*Keep all materials sorted using separate brown paper bags or plastic bags. If there isn't enough room in the bin, place additional bags of sorted material next to the recycling bin.

#### **GLASS - ONLY BOTTLES & JARS**

(Clear, green and brown glass containers)

- Must be clean and dry
- Remove caps and lids throw in garbage
- Labels are OK
- No window glass, laboratory glass, ceramic, china, pyrex, mirrors, or light bulbs

#### **TIN & ALUMINIM CANS**

(Food and beverage cans only)

- Must be clean and dry
- Remove labels
- May be flattened
- No ends unless still attached to the cans and folded in can
- No food trays, foil, scrap metal, pesticide cans, or paint cans

## **PLASTICS - ONLY BOTTLES & JUGS**

(#1 PETE Clear & #2 HDPE Opaque and colored)

- #1 PETE & #2 HDPE need to be separated into different bags
- Remove lids, rinse thoroughly and flatten
- No cups, tubs, food containers, or other non-bottle plastics, only 16 oz. or larger

**NEWSPAPER & ADVERTISING** 

- Do not tie in bundles or place in plastic bags

- No envelopes, junk mail, books, notebooks or

magazines (phonebooks are acceptable)

- Must be clean and dry

- No six-pack holders, plastic bags, buckets, toys, motor oil or pesticide bottles
- All plastics that are not accepted go with the trash

## **CORREGATED CARDBOARD & CEREAL BOXES**

(Cardboard with ridges or grooved inner surface-without plastic inserts)

- Must be clean, dry and flattened
- No wax-coated cardboard of any kind (ex: milk cartons or beverages boxes) beverage boxes)
- No staples
- No pizza boxes
